CGBF is pleased to add John Petersen, Associate Professor of Environmental Studies and Biology, Oberlin College, to this presentation.

John was instrumental in developing an award winning real time, floor-by-floor feedback system that allowed students in two halls-Harkness and Fairchild-to regularly monitor their use of electricity and water. This project won a \$75,000 award in the Environmental Protection Agency's P3 Student Design Competition for Sustainability (P3 stands for People, Prosperity, and Planet).

Speakers:

Leith Sharp established the Harvard Green Campus Initiative (HGCI) in March of 2000, becoming the Director of this emerging organization. She has worked with universities for the last 10 years to achieve organizational change in the pursuit of environmental sustainability. She also co-instructs the Harvard Extension School course, Sustainability - The Challenge of Changing Our Institutions.

John Petersen has co-authored a paper on "Oberlin College Lewis Center for Environmental Studies: A Low-Energy Academic Building" with NREL that was presented at the World Renewable Energy Congress VIII and Expo in 2004.
